Annual Meeting and Social Gathering November 21st at Erie Community Center

Sunwest residents will receive a letter during the last week in October to remind them about the Annual meeting that is scheduled for Monday, November 21st. This year the meeting will start with a social gathering from 6:00 p.m. to 6:30 p.m. in the Mitchell room of the Erie Community Center (450 Powers Street). Coffee, tea, water, and some snacks will be provided. The HOA business meeting will start at 6:30 p.m. The business meeting usually takes less than one hour.

Along with the reminder letter you will receive a proxy form and an absentee ballot. If you cannot attend the meeting, please send in the proxy form and absentee ballot. We need your proxy to conduct the annual business for Sunwest HOA.

Tree and Lawn Care

Fall preparation of your yard is almost as important as the spring preparation. Lawn aeration and fertilization strengthens root growth and turf development for a healthier greener lawn in the spring. Fall is also a good time to fertilize your trees, and to treat trees that are suffering from disease or insects. Common tree diseases around here include Aspen leaf fungus, and bark scale. Ashes are prone to bore insects, and Maples are prone to iron deficiency. Consult your local nursery for appropriate treatments.

Reminders for Fall Weather

Weeds never give up, never surrender. Weeds are the most common HOA Covenants violation. You can avoid that reminder letter from MSI by pulling them before they get big enough to notice.

Sprinkler systems need to be drained (blown out) before the first hard freeze, usually by mid-October.

The Town of Erie code requires sidewalks be

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cleaned of snow within 24 hours after a snow fall. The Town does not specify a minimum amount of snow. If you can see it on the sidewalk it needs to be cleaned off.
