Sunwest HOA Fees Due July 1st

3rd quarter HOA fees are due July 1st. There is a grace period, but if dues are not received within 30 days of the due date a \$25 late fee is charged to the homeowner's account. Delinquent accounts also accrue interest charges of 18%, so it pays to get your payments in on time.

Ease Off of Utility Easements

Sunwest has experienced a number of power outages recently. Some of these were due to failure of Xcel Energy equipment on Sunwest property. Homeowners should know there is a six foot easement along all property lines, and an eight foot easement along property lines that have utility boxes along that property line. These easements must be kept clear of structures such as utility sheds and obstructions such as bushes and trees. Utility workers must have access to service their equipment at any time of the day or night, whether the homeowner is home or absent. The most recent outage occurred due to a homeowner who allowed an Xcel Energy transformer to be landscaped over with dirt and had trees planted around the transformer. Eventually this abuse caused the unit to fail. This homeowner had so many trees planted in the easements that Xcel Energy had to access the faulty transformer by going through the next door neighbor's yard. This is an extreme example of a homeowner disregarding the utility easements, but it is a wakeup call for the rest of us to check any utility equipment on our property and make sure it is accessible to utility workers in case they need to service it.

Has Your Trash Container Seen Better Days?

If you have a broken trash or recycling container you can call Waste Connections at 303-665-6811 (press 1 for customer service) and they will arrange to

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replace your broken container with a new one at no charge to you. You just need to schedule one of the regular pickup days with customer service, and then leave your broken container out by the street after that pickup. Waste Connections will come by later to replace it. Just be sure you know which day they are going to do the replacement. It may not be the very next collection day after you call.

Speaking of Easements, How About Those Sidewalks?

Be nice to your neighbors and make sure your sidewalks are clear of overhanging branches or of bushes or flowers that extend into the walkway. The Town of Erie code enforcement says sidewalks must be clear up to a height of eight feet. If a six foot six person can walk down the middle of your sidewalk, and not get his hat knocked off, you won't be bothered by a friendly reminder letter from MSI, our property management company. If, however, there are obstructions on your sidewalk don't be surprised by that letter.

Sunwest has a lot of concrete drain pans crisscrossing many of the properties in the neighborhood. If there is a drain pan on your property please make sure that it is not holding water due to an accumulation of dirt or leaves. Standing water is just what mosquitoes need to make more mosquitoes.
